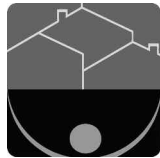

When these young people were asked to participate in a summer program to promote HIV/AIDS awareness through the arts and technology, there was both reluctance and curiosity. Reluctance because the topic of HIV/AIDS is taboo in minority communities around the country.
